





## **Notes on Today's Music**

---

†**Denis Bédard** was trained at the Conservatoire de musique du Québec à Québec where he obtained a deuxième prix harmony in 1966, a premier prix counterpoint in 1970, a premier prix fugue in 1971, premier prix organ in 1972, and a premier prix harpsichord and premier prix chamber music in 1973. A series of grants from the Canada Council enabled him to pursue studies in Paris with André Isoir (organ) and Laurence Boulay (harpsichord and figured bass realization) and in Montreal with Bernard Lagacé (organ and harpsichord) between 1973-1975. After winning the Prix d'Europe in 1975 for his harpsichord performance, he studied piano, harpsichord, and organ with Gustav Leonhardt in the Netherlands from 1975-1977.

††**Henry Thacker "Harry" Burleigh**, a baritone, was an African-American classical composer, arranger, and professional singer. He was the first black composer to be instrumental in the development of a characteristically American music and he helped to make black music available to classically trained artists both by introducing them to the music and by arranging the music in a more classical form.

## Amahl & The Night Visitors

Gian Carlo Menotti's 'Amahl and the Night Visitors' returns to Westminster Presbyterian Church presented by Nickel City Opera to celebrate The Feast of the Epiphany

Commissioned by network executives at NBC in 1950, Menotti wrote 'Amahl and the Night Visitors' with the inspiration of Hieronymus Bosch's painting 'Adoration of the Magi' and his own childhood memories in which the three kings, Melchior, Balthazar, and Kaspar, played much more important roles than did St. Nicholas. Amahl is the story of a crippled shepherd boy, prone to telling tall tales, who lives in poverty and obscurity with his weary, bitter mother. When the magi stop by their home on a cold winter night, a delightful story unfolds — but one that is also poignant and profound.

Music Director Matt Marco was eager to work on the production, "The church has a long history of finding unique ways to engage the community in worship, and with that spirit current Choirmaster Garrett Martin suggested 'Amahl' return in 2016. Presenting 'Amahl' at Westminster dates back to the tenure of Choirmaster Thomas Swan (1976-2001) and was a yearly Epiphany tradition. I've worked with Nickel City Opera on two productions of AMAHL and teaming up with them is the best way to present high quality performances for both the Westminster congregation, and the larger Western New York audience."

### *The Feast of the Epiphany*

Known as Three Kings Day and El Dia de los Tres Reyes, The Feast of the Epiphany is one of the oldest Christian feasts celebrated since the end of the second century before the Christmas holiday was established. While Roman Catholic and Protestant Christianity focuses on the story of the Magi, Eastern Christians, like the Greek Orthodox, celebrate the baptism of Jesus on Epiphany and consider the day to be more important than Christmas. Like other Christian seasons, the church appropriated Epiphany from an old pagan festival. As early as 1996 BCE, the Egyptians celebrated January 6th winter solstice with a tribute to Aeon, the Virgin.
