





And also with you.



Notes on Today's Music

†**Russell Schulz-Widmar** is a native son of Harvard, Illinois, where he was born on July 29, 1944. He was educated at Valparaiso University where he received his Bachelor's degree in Music. He completed his Master's degree at The School of Sacred Music, Union Seminary, and his Doctorate at the University of Texas. He has resided in Austin, Texas most of his adult life where he has served as Professor of Church Music at The Episcopal Theological Seminary, and director of music at the Episcopal Church of The Good Shepherd.

Dr. Schulz-Widmar chaired the hymn committee of The Episcopal Hymnal 1982, served a two-year term as President of The Hymn Society in the United States and Canada. A widely published author and composer of hymns and anthems, his text "Your Love, O God, Has Called Us Here" appears in most major new hymnals.

†† **Moses Hogan** was an African-American composer and arranger of choral music. He was best known for his settings of spirituals. Hogan was a pianist, conductor and arranger of international renown. He died suddenly of a brain tumor at the age of 45.

††† **Jane Marshall** is a hymn writer and composer of sacred choral music. She is a longtime member of the Sacred Music graduate faculty at Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University, Dallas. Today's anthem was commissioned by the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians in 1993.

†††† **Sir William Henry Harris** was an English organist and composer, affectionately nicknamed 'Doc H' by his choristers. Harris was born in Fulham, London, and died in Petersfield. At the age of 14, he took up a "flexible" position as Assistant Organist at St David's Cathedral in Wales, followed at 16 by a scholarship to the Royal College of Music where he was Professor of Organ and Harmony from 1921 to 1955. He was organist at St Augustine's Church, Edgbaston from 1911 to 1919 and concurrently Assistant Organist at Lichfield Cathedral followed in 1919 by becoming Organist successively at New College and in 1929 Christ Church, Oxford. He moved to St. George's Chapel, Windsor in 1933. As Organist at Windsor, Harris was at his most productive. He produced music for the Three Choirs Festival, was a conductor at both the 1937 and 1953 coronations, and had music premiered at the Proms, all of which led to being appointed KCVO in 1954. Harris is best remembered for his Anglican church music, though his main achievements were as a choir-trainer.
