Notes on Today's Music

He subsequently received degrees in Organ Performance and American History from Oberlin College. After studying law at the University of Michigan and pursuing a brief career as an attorney, he returned to his first love, sacred music. He undertook further study of Anglican choral training in 1996, when he spent a month in St. Albans, singing with and studying the Choir of St. Albans Cathedral, then directed by Barry Rose. John is the Director of Music at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Fairfield, CT. He is a member of the Association of Anglican Musicians, and has served as Dean of the Fairfield-West Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, and has served as a faculty member of the Bridgeport AGO Pipe Organ Encounter. John lives in New Haven with his wife Margaret and son Michael.


