Bestselling Christian activist, scholar, and author of *Why I Left, Why I Stayed: Conversations on Christianity Between an Evangelical Father and His Humanist Son*, Tony Campolo and his son Bart, an avowed Humanist, debate their spiritual differences and explore similarities involving faith, belief, and hope that they share.

Over Thanksgiving dinner, fifty-year-old Bart Campolo announced to his Evangelical pastor father, Tony Campolo, that after a lifetime immersed in the Christian faith, he no longer believed in God. The revelation shook the Campolo family dynamic and forced father and son to each reconsider his own personal journey of faith—dual spiritual investi-

gations into theology, faith, and Humanism that eventually led Bart and Tony back to one another.

As *Why I Left, Why I Stayed* makes clear, a painful schism between father and son that could have divided them irreparably, became instead an opening that offered each an invaluable look not only at what separated them, but more importantly, what they shared. **Books are \$14. 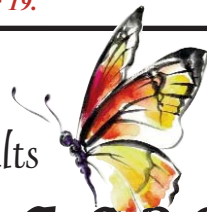

Monkey Bread

Monkey Bread – A Maine-iac Treat

Our friends in Hartford introduced us to Monkey Bread. It is our favorite treat when we're in Hartford.

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
 - 4 tubes of refrigerator biscuits (if you decide to use Pillsbury Grands you only need 2 tubes)
 - Mix together: 1½ c sugar and 1½ tsp cinnamon
 - Melt 1½ stick of butter.
 - Cut each biscuit into quarters.
 - Dust in sugar/cinnamon mixture.
 - Place into bundt pan.
 - Pour remaining sugar/cinnamon into melted butter.
 - Bring to boil, and then pour over the biscuits in the bundt pan.
- Bake 30-35 minutes.
- Invert and enjoy.

Compassion Stories

Sunday School Update

This summer, Westminster families will receive weekly emails containing Bible stories that focus on compassion. These stories from both the Old and New Testaments teach us how to love like God. You can find each week's compassion story booklets on the information table in the Gallery Room.

- Pick up a weekly booklet, and share the story with your family. A child-friendly version of the story is contained in each booklet, but if there are no children in your home, dip into your Bible and read. As you read each story, imagine you're there. Which character in the story do you most identify with? Each booklet contains an *Imagining Together* section that poses questions about each story, and then relates the

action of the stories to parallels in your own experiences.

- Start each week with that Bible story in mind. During the week think of ways you and your family can show God's compassion in your daily lives, whether at home, at work, or in your travels. Included in the booklets are story cards and posters to color for both children and adults. The posters would offer can be used as a meditative practice.
- In the church calendar, summer is part of Ordinary Time, with the liturgical color green to symbolize growth. Summer is a time of cultivation; whether in our gardens, families, or spiritual lives. Decide to read a compassion story once a week and allow the lessons of each story linger with you and your family during the week.

At this time in our nation and our world, we need to cultivate compassion. We do not know how and where the seeds of compassion we plant will blossom. We do know we are called to be kind and compassionate just as God has been and is with us.

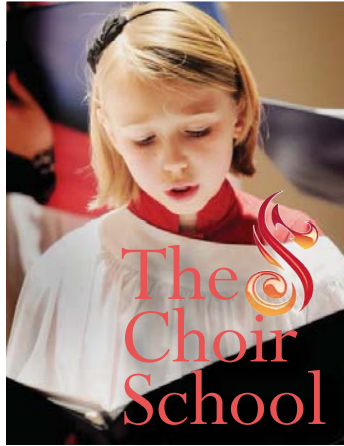


Sunday School at Westminster
